Statistics re service impacts

The following is a collation of data reported by DHBs during the eight days of industrial action over January and February.

The figures are preliminary and indicative as not all DHBs have reported consistently, however we're comfortable that the variation will not materially affect the trend shown – while there was an impact on individual patients, the impact of the strikes at a system level reduced as the action went on.

Key points to note include:

- While the number of RMOs working remained relatively even, DHBs were better able to manage the impacts – especially on surgery
- This reflects that the majority of RMOs who worked were registrars and that the membership of STONZ is predominantly surgical
- Between 59% and 64% of Registrars worked during the strikes
- Between 33% and 38% of House Officers worked during the strikes
- The number of RMOs working in the main tertiary hospitals was higher than the average – that's where most of the volumes and training occur

RMO Attendance during the Action – excludes West Coast

- Figures were not broken down by HO and Reg for the first two strikes
- They show that the strike is not as well supported by RMOs in vocational training well beyond the membership of STONZ and those on IEAs.
- These figures exclude West Coast DHB which was not part of the strike.
- Figures were not broken down by HO and Registrars for Counties and Southern during the last two strikes - in both those cases the level of RMOs working was above the national average
